

The Camping - carabaning "Domaine de la Bergerie" 3 ★★★

Welcomes you and hopes you will enjoy your stay at our camp site (14 ha)

Please consult the internal rules of general order posted in the entrance of the campsite. When you decide to stay with us this implies your acceptance of the rules and your willingness to act accordingly. The whole site is at your disposal but is also under your care. We ask your special attention for your children's behaviour.

At "La Bergerie" everybody chooses the pitch which suits him best (A, B or C according to condition). The prices are due whether you make use of all the facilities offered or not. Each family has a right to only one pitch, where also the car must be parked. All pitches which you use, are due. Please hang your number (which has been given to you at the office and for which you are responsible) on your installation so that it may easily be seen from the roadside.

The sanitary facilities and launderette are concentrated in the center of the campsite just as the facilities for the disabled. A perfect hygiene is our special aim and we count on you to leave these fittings in the same clean condition (parents should accompany their children) and dogs should be kept away. Please inform us of any pollution, alteration or bad working condition.

Families expecting visitors or messages are asked to inform the office and let us have the number of their location. Visitors are obliged to leave their car on the parking near the entrance and check in at the office before entering the campsite. They are not admitted to the swimming pools.

It is not allowed to pollute or dig holes in the ground. Caravanners must collect their waste water and empty that only at the places provided (special WC's have been set up to empty your pails and chemical toilets).

All campers are requested **not to empty waste water or other soapy water around the trees**, they would die.

Please hang up your washing discreetly (if possible behind your caravan or tent and in the morning only).

Barbecue and campfire are forbidden (by order of the Fire Department). No smoking in the woods! Don't cut the vegetation.

Pets are allowed only when vaccinated, tattooed and held on leash (if not its owner will be told to leave). Never should pets remain alone in the campsite during the absence of their master! **They are forbidden in the swimming pools!**

The manager have to give his agreement for all other unusual animals before to be allowed to stay in the campsite.

Community life demands respect for other people. Please don't be noisy. Transistors in particular should be turned down and not disturb your neighbour.

Everyone should respect other people's rest. Absolute quiet request from 22.30. During July an August the campsite is closed at night from 22.30 to 6.30 for cars (also campers) and non-residents. When returning after closing time you will have to leave your car on the parkingsite and walk silently to your pitch.

Any change in the number of persons, tents, caravans or vehicles must be reported to the office immediately (since fees will be due from the date of entrance of the customers).

Playground facilities, 1 tennis court and 2 swimming pools have been created for the recreation of young and old. Children have to be under supervision and responsibility of their parents. Each child under 12 years must be accompanied by an adult in the swimming pool.

The nearest beach is by the hippodrome at Cagnes-sur-Mer (10 km), Nice and Antibes (sandy beach) 20 km and Cannes (sandy beach) 30 km.

Nearby you will find: VENCE: an old Roman town and health-resort, frequented by artists and painters, its narrow old streets, its cathedral dating from the 10th-12th centuries, its thermal sources and its famous **Matisse Chapel**.

ST. PAUL-DE-VENCE: Medieval village (at 3 Km following the road towards the right when coming from the campingsite), and its modern art Fondation Maeght.

TOURRETTES-SUR-LOUP: typical meridional village, at 4 Km.

Excursions: wonderful places are to be discovered in the hinterland s.a. les GORGES DU LOUP and GOURDON the so-called "Belvédère of the Côte d'Azur", National Park of Mercantour....

Important: Please notify the office the day before you leave. Please leave your site in a condition as you would like to find it and according to standard of the campsite.

On the day of departure the pitch must be vacated by 12.00 noon, after that limit an extra night will automatically become due. Please respect the office's closing time.

If your staying is pleasant, do tell it around you, then your friends will appreciate themselves an enjoyable staying too.

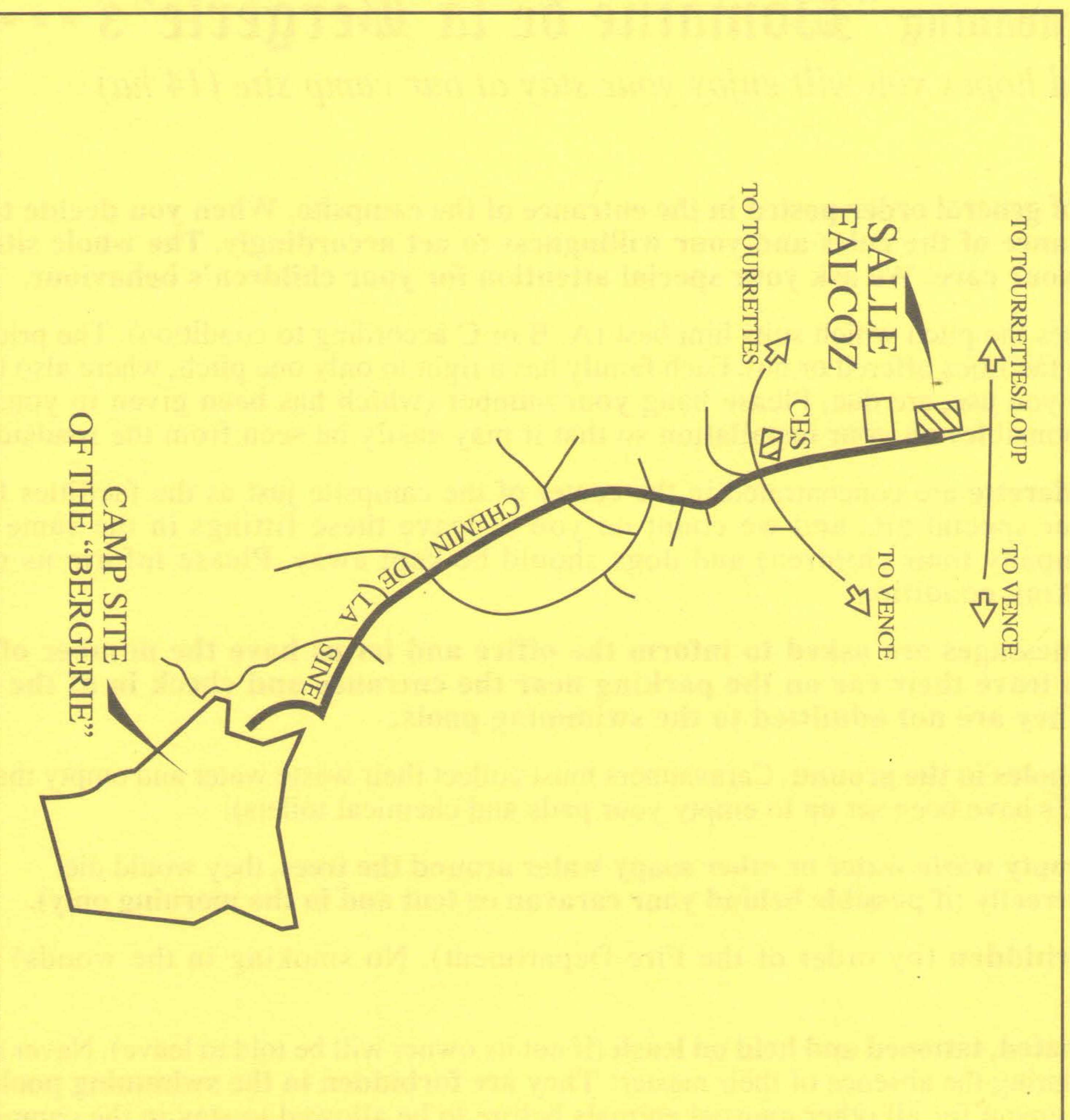
If you don't want to drive with your caravan all the time, leave it on the campsite on favourable terms. For information ask the office.

EMERGENCY INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE BERGERIE CAMP SITE

If an emergency occurs and at the request of the Authorities you may be asked to evacuate the site, and be relocated at the «Salle Falcoz» 1 km away in the direction of Vence (see map below).

A fire alarm (intermittant - continuous) will warn you. In this case take only your car and valuables (no tents or caravans). The Authorities will take care of your possessions while you are away.

RECYCLING

You must use special container outside the camp in front of the gates to let.

YELLOW CONTAINER

- wrapping and plastic contains like plastic bottle (shampoo, deterative and home clean contains...)
- wrapping paper and milk or food bricks
- metal contains like can-tins-aluminium contains, plastic or metal jerrycan, spray...

GREEN CONTAINER

- bottle, jam pot, baby food pot...

BLUE CONTAINER

- newspaper, magazine, advertisements...

GREY CONTAINER

- all other rubbish which can't be put in the yellow, green, or blue container.

In the camp site bin containers are made for daily rubbish.
Please stock nothing on the ground. Take care of cleanness.

All the recyclable things must be bring outside in the special containers.
